ADVENT IS A TIME OF WAITING AND PREPARATION FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE BIRTH OF JESUS.

The season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas and we use this time to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas. Advent means 'Coming' and is seen as the coming of Jesus into the world. This actually means three things. The first is the one we think of the most and it happened around 2000 years ago, when Jesus was born to live as a man and to die for us. The second is happening now! Jesus wants to come into our lives and be a part of it.

Finally, there is the future. Jesus will come back to the world as a King and a judge, not as a baby.

So spend some time together as a family and join Mary on her amazing journey! It doesn't matter how many people are in your family or how young they are. You can choose the activities to suit your family.

Spend time together with Mary and journey with her, journey with your family and friends, journey with your community and finally journey with the world.

How can we say 'Yes!' like Mary did this Advent?

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HOW TO USE THIS BOOKLET

Spend some time together each day. Make it a special time by lighting a candle. You could make your own Advent Wreath to light at home, use an Advent Candle with the days on it or use any candle that you have at home. The first session each week, will need a bit longer as there are things to read and talk about. The rest of the week will be time for daily prayer together and choosing activities to do.

Above all, enjoy your time together, talk about what you read, ask questions and help each other to grow in faith.

THINGS TO DO

Read the story

Each week begins with a passage from the Bible. The passage is provided in the booklet, but if you have a Bible at home you might like to use that instead. If you have younger members of the family, you might have a children's Bible that you could read from.

Make sure you talk about any words that your younger children don't understand or anything that they would like to ask. You might not have the answers (and there might not be an answer!) but that is OK. Just discuss your ideas.

Reflect and Pray

After the Bible passage there are some questions to talk about and discuss. Again, you might not know the answers and that is fine. Just talk together about what you think and don't be afraid to look things up! There is something to read and reflect on followed by 'Mary's Message' for the week. Talk about how you can try to follow it.

Also provided is a prayer or a prayer activity. Try to spend time each day together talking to God through prayer.

Things to do

The last page is full of things to do. Many of them do not require special materials or the need to prepare anything and you can choose what you would like to do. They don't all involve making something and you might also have your own ideas of things you could do to fit the week's theme. Not everyone has to do the same thing and you can spread them out throughout the week.



WEEK 1 THE ANNUNCIATION

SAYING 'YES' TO THE JOURNEY



READ LUKE 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.



SAYING 'YES' TO THE JOURNEY



Why did God choose Mary to be the mother of his Son?

How did Mary feel when the angel left?

When have you said yes to something that was new and scary? What did Gabriel's words, "Nothing will be impossible with God" mean?



MARY'S MESSAGE

Mary did one simple thing. She listened to what God asked her to do and she said 'Yes'.

How can we say 'Yes' to God?

We too are called to be filled with the Holy Spirit. When the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, she probably had important things to do. She wasn't ready for the drastic change in her life, but she was open to it. She set aside her plans and her intentions and opened herself up to what God wanted her to do.

Around the world, every day, many Christians stop whatever they are doing to pray the Angelus. By using the words of Mary in the Angelus, we let God know that his will for us is the most important thing.

When we pray the Angelus, we set aside our to do lists, our homework, our never-ending list of things we want to do and we turn to God and say, "Lord, let it be done to me according to your word (not mine)."

No matter what we do, no matter if we succeed or fail, we can trust in God to provide.

Maybe you pray the Angelus daily or maybe it is new to you. **Pray the Angelus together as a family each day this week.**

THE ANGELUS

The Angel of the Lord brought tidings to Mary,

And she conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed are thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Behold the handmaid of the Lord;

Be it unto me according to thy

word.

Hail, Mary, full of grace,...

And the Word was made flesh

And dwelt among us.

Hail, Mary, full of grace,...

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

ACTIVITIES TO DO

ANGEL CRAFT

SAYING 'YES'

READ LUKE 1:39-45



In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. READ LUKE 1:46-56

And Mary said,

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

He has shown strength with his arm;

he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

He has brought down the powerful from their thrones,

and lifted up the lowly;

he has filled the hungry with good things

and sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel,

in remembrance of his mercy,

according to the promise he made to our ancestors,

to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

And Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home.

Who do you think the 'lowly' are? Mary thanks God for all the good things he has done for her. **What** good things has God done for you?

Elizabeth gave Mary the highest praise; she called her "most blessed among women," and recognised her as the mother of God. It doesn't get much better than that! This is the second time in which Mary was praised so highly. The Angel Gabriel told her she was the "favoured one" of God.

If that had been you or me, I daresay there's a possibility that we would have been beaming with pride. We all want to claim the credit we deserve don't we?

Instead, Mary turned it all around and gave all of the credit to God. Mary's words are known as the Magnificat, a prayer of praise, thanksgiving, humility; a prophecy; and a history lesson all rolled into one.

God is way too big for our homes and church buildings. He is too concerned for all the people who are not there. God is going out into the world to find all the lonely, sad, trapped people and we are called to look for God there and help out.

So get involved! Watch for God at work and be ready to help.

MARY'S MESSAGE

Mary was a poor, simple girl from Nazareth. But she recognised and accepted the gift God had given her. She praised God for what He was going to do for the world through her.

Don't deny, play down or ignore your gifts!

Thank God for them and use them to do His will.

WEEK 4 THE BIRTH OF JESUS JOURNEY WITH THE WORLD





READ

LUKE 2:21-20

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!" When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them

REFLECT AND PRAY

Why do you think the angels appeared to the shepherds and not rich, important people?

Jesus wasn't born in a fancy hotel or a palace. Why do you think that was?

How do you think the shepherds felt at different parts in the story? **Did** their feelings change?

MARY'S MESSAGE

Mary did not become upset when there was no room anywhere for her to have her baby. She just trusted that, with God, everything would be ok.

When things are difficult, do we look to Mary to learn from her complete trust in God?

The angels appear, this time not to a single person in private, but before the shepherds to declare the good news of the birth of Jesus. The shepherds rushed straight away to see the baby and then told other people what they had seen and heard. They could not contain their joy and happiness any longer. The amazing love of Jesus cannot be kept hidden and to ourselves. It wants to burst out into the world.

The greatest event in history had just happened! The king had been born! For ages the Jews had waited for this moment, but it was announced to humble shepherds. Jesus comes to all, including the poor and ordinary. Whoever we are and whatever we do, we can have Jesus in our lives. We don't need extraordinary qualifications, money, popularity or anything else. He accepts us as we are.

We are in much the same position as the shepherds. We have heard the good news, and now the question is: What will we do with it?

JOURNEY TO BETHLEHEM MEAL

Share a very simple meal together just like Mary and Joseph would have done on their way to Bethlehem.

- sit on blankets on the floor with only candles for light.
- eat with your hands and not with cutlery.
- you could dress up in biblical costumes.
- before you eat, re-read the Bible passage for this week.
- during you meal talk about the Bible passage and how Mary and Joseph might have felt.

What to eat:

A poor couple like Mary and Joseph, would usually have eaten:

- fish, poultry, eggs, goats cheese
- · something like pitta bread
- lentils, chickpeas (e.g. hummus), onions, olives
- almonds, pistachios
- honey
- figs, dates, grapes, pomegranates
- wine or grape juice
