Pre-visit Risk Assessment (planning visits for teachers & leaders).

The Director of Education advises teachers & leaders to visit the site prior to school visits, if this is possible, to carry out a risk assessment and view all places where the children will be working during their visit. Alternatively teachers are welcome to discuss all issues fully over the telephone.

During the course of a visit, children may be visiting other sites in the village which are not owned by the Shrine (e.g. The Abbey Grounds, Methodist Church, Orthodox Church, Roman Catholic Church or Roman Catholic Shrine). We strongly recommend therefore that teachers and leaders visit these sites and/or make relevant enquiries about risk assessments to the agency concerned, prior to the visit. Ask us for more information if required.

At present the **Schools Department's Safeguarding Policy** is compiled in accordance with the recommendations of the Diocese of Norwich Board of Education. It is displayed in the Shrine *and the Safeguarding Officer (Caroline Ward – c.ward@olw-shrine.org.uk) is the named person for safeguarding/disclosure.* Please ask for a copy if you would like one.

The Director of Education, The Education Officer and teachers in the department will organise and lead all activities during day or residential visits but overall discipline remains the responsibility of the class teacher/group organiser. **Our staff should always have at least one of your staff/helpers with them.**

Risk assessments are regularly carried out at the Shrine. The Schools Department liaises with our Health and Safety Officer, in accordance with The Health and Safety at work etc. Act 1974 and The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. Please ask if you need extra information.

The Shrine holds a Learning Outside the Classroom (LOtC) quality mark and this is assessed biannually to ensure compliance.
